Attendees:

- Charlie from Bryn Mawr Film Institute will be stepping down.
- Bryn Mawr Trust will become WSFS and we will be asking for a person to join the Board.
- Holiday lights will be going up on 10/29/21 and Tim will be there to check all the lights and poles to make sure all is working. K. Barton is very involved in these efforts as well.
- Bryn Mawr Night was very successful and well attended. This event is becoming a signature night as it was held on a Friday. We had great media coverage. Wolfe Performing Arts Center was part of the entertainment and the restaurants were very busy. It was noted that none of the restaurants are current BMBA members.
- Bryn Mawr Hospital has reported a slight decline in COVID cases with 2 out of 8 cases being breakthrough. Employees must be vaccinated by 11/1/21 and is mandatory. The flu vaccine will be available next week. John Schwarz from Bryn Mawr Hospital was noted as a potential speaker for future General Membership Meetings.
- D. Cuff reported balances of \$12,130 and \$33,966 for BMBA and BMDay respectively.
- S. Zelov reported on the success of Clover Market. Lower Merion Township still has forgivable loans available as all the money has not been used. Eric will send the information. The township has also approved the apartment building project at Bryn Mawr and Lancaster Avenues. There will be retail stores and apartments, no offices.
